



The governor wants to force *more* housing on Long Island.¹ *It's a bad idea*.

In 2022, the governor pushed to override local zoning laws and mandate that local governments must permit Accessory Dwelling Units (ADUs) on every residential lot. This measure would have slowly eliminated single family zoning. We Long Islanders told her it was a bad idea, so she backed off.²

This year, she wants to try again.

The governor is ready to overrule local governments³ with state mandates that will change the character of our communities forever.⁴ The governor's plan would:

- Create a state housing board with the authority to override local zoning decisions
- X Re-zone areas within a 1/2 mile of a train station to permit an average housing density of 20 units per acre
