Dear Neighbor,

As we near the start of a new legislative session, my office and I have been busy helping the community in many ways.

My humanitarian drive for the people of Ukraine was a tremendous success. With the help of partners like Long Island Cares, Hope for Ukraine, and Ukrainian Americans of Long Island, an astonishing 5 tons of donated goods were shipped. It was amazing to see our community come together for such a worthy cause.

It is my core belief that public education is an investment in our future, and we must invest in it accordingly. With that in mind, I continue to secure grants to help districts to fund essential programs and make much needed capital improvements to their facilities. Safety is paramount as well. My office responded to calls for changes at one area middle school by helping to implement traffic calming devices. This made pick-ups and drop-offs safer for students and parents. Studies are showing the toll the pandemic has taken on education. My office participated in the Assembly Summer Reading Program to help prevent kids from regressing as they head into the new school year.

Education is also the best tool we have to fight hate. Working in collaboration with Governor Hochul, my amendment to the education law will require museums to acknowledge art stolen from the Jewish community during the Nazi era in Europe.

Women's rights are under attack as never before in the aftermath of the Supreme Court's decision to overturn the landmark Roe v. Wade ruling. With many states enacting laws denying women the right to control their own bodies, I sponsored multiple bills in the Assembly which make New York a safe haven for women seeking what is their basic human right.

The mass shooting at a Buffalo supermarket and countless more instances of gun violence are stark reminders of why we need stricter gun laws. While my ghost guns bill has become an effective tool for law enforcement in the fight against illegal guns, I will continue to fight for strong but sensible gun legislation to keep our communities safe.


I continue to be honored to represent the people of the 13th Assembly District, an area teeming with diversity. I am also proud to serve as Chairman of the Judiciary Committee.




