FEMA – Region 2,

Our office has been made aware of the proposed construction of a seawall at Lawrence High School in Cedarhurst, (Lawrence High School Flood Mitigation Cedarhurst, Nassau County, New York FEMA-4085-DR-NY) a project aimed at safeguarding the campus from the impact of severe weather events. While we appreciate the efforts to mitigate future tidal surges and flooding, there are concerns within the community, especially among the residents of the Village of Cedarhurst. The Lawrence High School sits within a residential zone, and the construction of the seawall raises apprehensions about potential adverse effects on the neighboring homes. It is crucial to ensure that the measures taken to protect the school do not inadvertently redirect seawater and create new challenges for the residents.

Our primary concern is the lack of information on the measures FEMA has implemented to safeguard the residents and residential units from the potential consequences of this mitigation effort. The community, apart from a newspaper notice, seems to have received minimal notification regarding the project. We believe that such a significant initiative requires more interactive communication and collaboration with the local community, and we urge FEMA to engage in a more inclusive dialogue with the residents.

Additionally, we would like to inquire whether any investigation was made about the feasibility of relocating the high school to the underutilized Lawrence Middle School, which is situated on higher ground? This option, along with other district properties on higher ground, could potentially serve the purpose of safeguarding the school without incurring the substantial cost of \$75 million. We understand the importance of protecting the Lawrence High School, but exploring alternatives and engaging the community in the decision-making process is crucial.
