 The governor announced that he will not ban individuals from going door-to-door to trick or treat on Halloween.

- The state will, however, provide guidance on how individuals can safely participate. Read more <u>here</u>.
- On Tuesday, the Department of Health announced that New York **nursing homes** that have gone **14** days without a coronavirus case can reopen for limited visitation. Read more <u>here.</u>
- The **Special Enrollment** Period for uninsured New Yorkers will be extended through **December 31**st.
- The governor announced that announced that six states— California, Hawaii, Maryland, Minnesota, Nevada and Ohio—have been removed from New York State's COVID-19 travel advisory. Puerto Rico has been added. Read more here.
- Lower-risk school sports are able to start on Monday, September 21st statewide but teams won't be able to practice or play outside of their region until October 19th.

NYC: MAYOR DE BLASIO AGAINST HATE

- Mayor Bill de Blasio announced that in-person learning will be delayed for some students. All students will not return to school buildings on Monday, September 21st. The updated schedule to return to school is:
 - Monday, September 21st: Blended learning students in grades 3-K and Pre-K, as well as all grades in District 75;
 - Tuesday, September 29th: Blended learning students enrolled in K-5 and K-8 schools; and
 - Thursday, **October 1**st: Blended learning students enrolled in middle schools, high schools, secondary schools (schools spanning grades 6-12), and transfer schools/adult education.
 - The mayor also announced that an additional 2,500 educators in addition to the 2,000 that was added on Monday will be added to NYC schools.
- The mayor announced a new initiatives to address the city's sanitation and street cleanliness efforts.
 - The Department of Sanitation of NY is restoring approximately 65 litter basket sanitation trucks.
 - The New York City Economic Development Corporation is restarting CleaNYC to:
 - provide supplemental cleaning services in neighborhoods and parks through the end of 2020; and
 - partner with the DOE Fund, to provide employment, career training, and social services to homeless and formerly incarcerated individuals.
- The city launched a citywide multi-language campaign to encourage people to take the flu vaccine. For more information, visit here.

- NYC Test and Trace Corps has prevented up to **15,000** potential new COVID-19 cases.
 - Nearly 80% of all positive COVID-19 cases completed Test and Trace Corps' intake.
 - New test and trace hotline is (212)COV-ID19.
 - The hotline operates from 9:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m. everyday.
- The mayor announced that there is a need for blood donation. To make an appointment to donate blood, visit here or call (800) 933-2566.
- The mayor announced that starting October
 1st through March, the mayor's office
 will furlough every mayor's office employee, nearly 500 employees, for 5 days.
 - The mayor will be included in this furlough.
 - This furlough will save NYC \$860,000 in revenue.

- Mayor de Blasio announced a "Heart Work against Hate" initiative for youth, launched by the Office for the Prevention of Hate Crimes.
 - NYC youth **ages 10** to **18** are eligible to apply.
 - The deadline for submission is Wednesday, September 30th.



- The United States Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) announced that immigration fees are going up effective October 2nd.
 - Fee waivers will be eliminated for many applications, including form N-400, Application for Naturalization.
 - The citizenship application fee will increase from \$640 to \$1,160 for an online application or \$1,170 for a paper application.




