

<u>April 18, 2019</u>

Greetings,

On April 1st we passed the state budget. For a quick summary on a number of items please click here. Included in the budget were provisions for congestion pricing, environmental protections such as banning single use plastic bags from our waste stream, and eliminating cash bail for most misdemeanors and certain non-violent felonies.

Over the next three months the Assembly will be taking up a number of impactful issues ranging from the possible legalization of adult use marijuana to the continued strengthening our environmental laws.

Among our first orders of business in the coming weeks will be New York City's rent laws which are set to expire in in June. For too long our rent laws have been tipped in favor of large landlords. The Legislature is seriously considering a complete overhaul of the rules governing rent control, and I support eliminating preferential rent, vacancy decontrol, vacancy bonuses and reforming major capital improvement and interior improvement add-ons.

The Assembly will hold public hearings on this very important topic in New York City on May 2nd from 10am to 7pm at 250 Broadway and again in May 10th in Albany, NY from 10am to 7pm. I look forward to discussing the issue with you and strengthening our rent laws and provide relief to our already overburdened tenants.
