As we close out 2023, I want to let you know why I remain committed to serving as your representative in Albany. This year, my colleagues in the New York State Legislature passed a \$229 billion budget and we secured \$329 million for NYCHA residents who owed back rent. We also invested more money in education and healthcare, and provided a "clean slate" for returning citizens.

In November, three of my bills became law and I am very proud of A.7677 – The Community Hiring Bill, which requires businesses that receive New York City contracts to hire people from zip codes with high unemployment.

We had some wins but there is more to do!

Unemployment, crime, and the lack of repairs affect our quality of life. That is why I want to continue working with you to promote safety, address the critical repairs, and provide access to good jobs and/or business opportunities.

Growing up in Gowanus Houses gave me the passion and foundation for public service. I learned to stand up for myself, handle conflict, and volunteer to improve my community. With everyone from the youth to the elders, new residents, and old-timers doing their part, we can make NYCHA a better place to live, learn, play, work, and be social.

As we look to 2024, let there be peace on earth, and let that peace begin with us.


