Ramadan Celebration



FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

- ⌚ DO I NEED IDENTIFICATION TO SURRENDER A GUN?
NO, ABSOLUTELY NO IDENTIFICATION IS REQUIRED.
- ⌚ HOW DO I BRING A GUN TO THE DROP OFF SITE?
GUNS MUST BE PLACED IN A PLASTIC OR PAPER BAG OR BOX.
- ⌚ CAN I TRANSPORT THE GUN IN A CAR?
IF TRANSPORTING THE GUN BY CAR, THE GUN MUST BE TRANSPORTED IN THE TRUNK OF THE CAR.
- ⌚ WHEN DO I GET THE CASH CARD?
AFTER THE GUN IS SCREENED BY OFFICERS, YOU WILL BE ISSUED A CASH CARD.
- ⌚ HOW MANY GUNS CAN I SURRENDER?
YOU MAY SURRENDER AS MANY GUNS AS YOU WISH, BUT YOU WILL ONLY RECEIVE PAYMENT FOR UP TO THREE GUNS FOR A MAXIMUM PAYOUT OF \$600.
- ⌚ IS THERE A PHONE NUMBER I CAN CALL FOR MORE INFORMATION?
YES, YOU CAN CALL 311 FOR INFORMATION REGARDING THE NYC GUN BUY BACK PROGRAM TO REDUCE VIOLENT CRIME.
- ⌚ CAN ANY MEMBER OF THE PUBLIC SURRENDER A GUN?
YES, ACTIVE OR RETIRED LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS AND LICENSED GUN DEALERS ARE NOT ELIGIBLE TO PARTICIPATE IN THE PROGRAM.



Highlights for the 2021-2022 NYS Budget

Our State Legislature passed a historic \$212 billion budget to jump start New York's economic recovery due to the COVID-19 Pandemic just a few weeks ago. Updates From Albany

This week the New York State Legislature passed legislation that will protect New Yorkers from exposure to airborne infectious diseases by reducing workplace transmission and community spread through enforceable health and safety standards.

- Currently, there is no federal or state law protecting workers from exposure to airborne infectious disease in the workplace.
- While there are several state executive orders and regulation in place that aim to reduce workplace transmission, they do not cover all industries or protect all workers.
- The NY HERO Act would require the Department of Labor, in consultation with the Department of Health, to create an airborne infectious disease standard covering all private employers.

- The department would publish such model standard in English and Spanish and any additional language approved by the Commissioner of Labor.

- The plan would set minimum standards for preventing exposure to airborne disease, including employee health screenings, personal protective equipment (PPE), accessible handwashing stations and regular facility cleaning.
- It would require all private businesses to implement this model or a similar plan.
- This bill would also create joint employer-employee workplace health and safety committees where there are 10 or more employees.
- To ensure employees feel protected to speak out, it would prohibit employers from retaliating against workers.
- The legislation was passed this week by the Assembly and Senate and is expected to be delivered to the Governor for execution action.

“I am proud to support and help pass this legislation to honor New Yorkers who showed up at their job each day and helped keep our state running at the height of this pandemic. They showed unwavering bravery and strength as they put their health at risk to keep our state and communities

moving forward.

It is only befitting that this legislation be called the NY Hero Act. New Yorkers deserve to feel protected in their workplaces.”



The Assembly Majority passed legislation to create enforceable health and safety workplace standards to protect against airborne infectious diseases like COVID-19 (A.2881-B).

This week the Assembly passed an Earth Day Legislative Package to safeguard the environment

- In 2019, the Legislature passed the Climate Leadership and Community Protection Act (CLCPA), setting critical environmental standards, including reducing greenhouse gas emissions and increasing the use of renewable energy to address and mitigate the effects of climate change.
- This year's Earth Day legislative package includes two measures that will help New York reach the goals set by the CLCPA by reducing emissions from the transportation sector, which is currently one of the largest contributors to greenhouse gas emissions in the state.

One of these measures sets the goal that all in-state sales of new passenger cars and trucks, as well as off-road vehicles and equipment would be

- zero-emissions by 2035, and medium- and heavy-duty vehicles would be zero-emissions by 2045.

The second measure would help remove

- barriers to electric vehicle charging infrastructure by requiring the Public Service Commission to create a more flexible billing system for commercial electric vehicle charging stations.
- In addition to legislation passed this week, the Assembly Climate Change Work Group will monitor the implementation of the Climate Leadership and Community Protection Act (CLCPA) and continue to explore policy initiatives on both the state and federal levels to combat the effects of climate change.

The Work Group will ensure that recommendations and timeframes from the Climate Action Council comply, as well as examine additional policy initiatives that may be helpful in addressing climate change. This may include modifications to existing laws and regulations such as increased access and usage of electric vehicles, improved

- air quality and decreased greenhouse gas emissions from landfills and power plants.



Critical Updates, New Policies, and Testing Locations to Protect You and Your Community

1. This week it was announced that the statewide 7-day average COVID-19 positivity rate dropped to 2.80 percent, the lowest since November 12. ICU patients dropped to 823, the lowest since December 3, and intubations dropped to 504, the lowest since December 7.
2. Tax Day for individuals extended to May 17: Treasury, IRS extend filing and payment deadline. The Treasury Department and Internal Revenue Service announced today that the federal income tax filing due date for individuals for the 2020 tax year will be automatically extended from April 15, 2021, to May 17, 2021. The IRS will be providing formal guidance in the coming days
3. Everyone in United States aged 16 years and above is now eligible for COVID-19 vaccination, the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) said on Monday. People aged 16 years and above who have underlying medical conditions that increase the risk of serious, life-threatening complications from COVID-19, should be among those offered the vaccine first, according to the U.S. health agency's latest recommendations



CLIENT SUCCESS STORY

Mr. M, a 60-year-old Black homeowner, fell one month behind on her mortgage when she had to pay for medical expenses for his wife. She was unable to make her payments, but when her servicing was transferred to a new company, the new mortgage company would not accept her payments. Mr. M tried to negotiate with his lender, but it refused to work with her even though she had been making her payments. After three years, Mr. M tried to negotiate with his lender, but it refused to work with her even though she had been making her payments. Mr. M was able to connect with Brooklyn Legal Services, who helped her negotiate with her lender. Her lender agreed to accept her payments again, and she was able to keep her \$300 per month in her housing expenses by allowing her family to remain in their home.


