- Budget negotiations are ongoing; as in most years, this year's budget is not held up by fiscal concerns but instead by some policy items that the Governor wants to advance immediately. New York remains in a strong fiscal position and will remain so unless and until federal cuts happen. We all expect to have emergency budget meetings in the fall after the federal government passes its budget.
- I joined the Citywide Council on High Schools' 4th Annual Legislative Breakfast to share some of my ongoing work in Albany, including expanding opportunities for technical training in schools and ensuring that students do not lose access to their facilities due to early voting.

The Assemblymember attended Temple Emanu-El's 180th Anniversary Shabbat Service, celebrating a milestone in the temple's long-standing commitment to the Manhattan community. Founded in 1845 by 37 German Jewish immigrants, it has grown to be the largest Reform Synagogue in the world.





Assemblymember Bores joined the Sutton Area Community Annual Easter Egg Hunt. Even the rain could not dull the children's enthusiasm, and Alex was glad to support a cherished neighborhood tradition that brings families together year after year.



Assemblymember Bores participated in a panel hosted by the Community Service Society (CSS) on the inequity in New York City's property tax system. He highlighted how antiquated zoning laws continue to hurt renters and short-change East Siders living in multifamily apartment complexes. CSS recently issued a report on property taxes that endorsed two of Alex's bills that would spur housing growth and lower costs for the vast majority of New Yorkers.

The Assemblymember recognized Matthew Tirschwell with a proclamation for his quick and selfless response on January 16th, when a man fell onto the tracks at East 86th Street. As a longtime volunteer EMS, Matthew jumped onto the tracks and applied a tourniquet that saved the man's life. REAL ID DEADLINE MAY 7

The Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) has extended hours on Thursdays starting April 3 to help New Yorkers process REAL ID and Enhanced ID applications ahead of the May 7 federal deadline.

Offices in metropolitan New York and Long Island will operate from 7:30 a.m. to 6:30 p.m. on Thursdays, and customers are encouraged to make reservations online.
