Assemblymember Seawright Honors "Women of Distinction" During Women's History Month

March 24, 2021 --- To commemorate 2021 Women's History Month, Assemblymember Rebecca Seawright last evening honored women leaders of distinction for their achievements, noteworthy contributions, and outstanding work on behalf of the community on the Upper East Side and Roosevelt Island.

"We celebrate women today who are exemplary change-makers and influencers and the pioneers of the past upon whose shoulders we stand," Assemblymember Seawright said. "They all inspire us to resist and keep up the fight. To the Women of Distinction, we say congratulations! You are an enduring inspiration to our entire community, our beloved city, and our great state of New York!"

The distinguished honorees hail from public service, neighborhood businesses, volunteer and non-profit institutions, publishing, medical institutions, civic organizations, and labor unions.

Honorees receive a New York State Assembly citation recognizing "outstanding work on behalf of the community...worthy of esteem for her civic dedication and service, essential to the advancement of the residents of the 76th Assembly District and the State of New York."

Included in the 2021 celebration are honorees announced in 2020 but unable to receive recognition due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

2021 "Women of Distinction" Honorees

Cynthia McCollum, Women of Distinction 2021 keynote speaker, is Senior Vice President, Hospital Administration at Memorial Sloan Kettering Cancer Center, where she has served for more than three decades. Before coming to MSKCC, she worked at Mt. Sinai School of Medicine and the John A. Hartford Foundation.

Jeanne Straus is president of Straus News, publisher of Our Town, and 16 newspapers in New York, New Jersey, and Pennsylvania. She took Straus News from four to 19 community publications in print and online. Under her superb leadership, the publications have won numerous awards for reporting, advertising, and design excellence.

Dorian Colucci Mecir is the proud owner of Dorian's Seafood Market, located at 1580 York Avenue. Dorian began her career in the seafood industry at the Rosedale Fish Market and was inspired to continue the decades-old tradition of providing quality catch and excellent customer service to the neighborhood. Dorian is a sponsor of the Carl Schurz Park Conservatory, Candlelighters NYC, Small Business Mentors NYC, City of Hope, Mt. Sinai Hospital, and the American Cancer Society.

Gayle Baron has devoted her life to community and public service. She recently completed three years as First Vice-Chair of Community Board 8. She also serves as president of the NYC Academies Foundation and managing partner of Trinary Group LLC. Mrs. Baron served as executive director of the New York Women's Agenda (NYWA), a coalition of 100 diverse NYC women's organizations representing 155,000 women. Initiatives included financial literacy programs for NYC's youth, women's entrepreneurship programs, and access to quality health care.

Saundrea I. Coleman is a 2020 graduate of Alliance Theological Seminary, where she received a Master's of Divinity degree. She is a consecrated deaconess of the A.M.E. Zion church, and she serves at Isabella Nursing home in the Pastoral Services Department. She co-founded and co-hosts the OneNYCHA podcast on public housing issues and an organizer of the UES4BLM Vigil at Carl Schurz Park each evening since the June 2020 murder of George Floyd.

Deputy Inspector **Melissa Eger** is the commanding officer of the NYPD's 19th Precinct. Egerrecently led the 122nd Precinct, which covers the South Shore of Staten Island. She began her NYPD career as an officer in Central Brooklyn, later being promoted to sergeant while working in Northern Brooklyn.

Aiesha Eleusizov is the Manhattan Association Chair for Girl Scouts of Greater New York and a troop leader for Troop 3001 and Troop 3244. Over the past eight years, Aiesha, with co-leader Yitza Martinez and the girls of their troops, have spent countless hours making Roosevelt Island a better place. In her professional life, Aiesha is a Senior Program Officer in education leadership at The Wallace Foundation, where she works to foster equity and improvements in learning and enrichment for young people.

Betsy Feist is executive director of the East River Democratic Club dedicated to sustaining our neighborhood as a place where all thrive through advocacy, by helping others, solving problems, and organizing fora to hear from and question our representatives. She is well-known for her longstanding and

dedicated community activism.

Dr. **Katherine Teets Grimm** is a physician who specializes in pediatrics and child abuse. In addition to her private practice on Roosevelt Island, she serves as a child abuse pediatrician for the Mount Sinai Medical System and the New York Center for Children.

Wendy Machaver has worked on the American Stock Exchange's trading floor, advocated for the educational rights of children with disabilities, advised teachers about including different types of learners in the mainstream classroom, and served as a caregiver to beloved family members. Wendy champions measures to reverse climate change pollution and is currently a public member on Manhattan Community Board 8's Social Justice Committee. Under a nom de plume, she has written and published three romance novellas.

Josephine Napolitano, a daughter of immigrants, is the owner of highly regarded Arturo's Restaurant on York Avenue. She is honored to serve the community and considers Yorkville and its residents an extension of her home and family.

Margaret Price is a journalist, editor, author, and past president of the New York Financial Writers' Association. As a community activist, she promotes women's issues through her role as co-chair of the Women & Families Committee of Community Board 8-Manhattan.

Gabrielle Ross is a programmer and app developer, proficient in multiple coding languages, and a High School sophomore at The Brearley School. Gabrielle is part of a three-person team that enters coding competitions and hackathons nationally and created Volunteer Cloud, a website for volunteers to find opportunities.

Shirley Zussman is a sex therapist based in New York City. Zussman was supervised through her graduate dissertation by Margaret Mead, and in the 1960s, studied sex therapy under Masters and Johnson, the inspiration for the Showtime series Masters of Sex. She is 106 years young and is an activist in the East 79 Street Neighborhood Association.

Serena Sabet, a senior at the Spence School, has worked on community service projects that benefit homeless people and underprivileged children. As a daughter of two immigrants and a mixed woman of Persian, Macanese, and English descent, she has also been the head of her school's multiracial affinity group for the past two years.

Shari Weiner is the former Mayor and Township Attorney of Livingston, NJ. She is a member of CB8, where she serves as co-chair of the Voting Reform Task Force. Shari is currently a member of the Executive Committees of LPAC, Tri-State Maxed Out Women's PAC, and the Women's Political Caucus of NJ. Shari is passionate about getting more women involved in the political process and getting more women into elective office.

Julia Wischnevsky is a civic-minded student dedicated to advocating for social justice and effecting positive change. For the past three and a half years, she has addressed teen mental health issues and eliminated the stigma surrounding mental illness. She led a team of peers in drafting legislation to

provide all New York City public schools with full-time, DOE-funded social workers and integrate mental health into the pre-existing health curriculum. Julia is currently a junior at Eleanor Roosevelt High School. She furthers her leadership, and civic efforts through dedicated participation in her school's Law Team, School Leadership Team, Equity Team, Spanish Club, and Girls Lead Our World Club.

2020 "Women of Distinction" Honorees

As a lifelong advocate for gender equality, **Julia Fan's** career has focused on women and girls' empowerment issues globally. Educated at Vassar College and Columbia's School of International and Public Affairs, she has worked at Human Rights in China, the Clinton Foundation, UNFPA (Beijing), and The Hunger Project.

Chief Medical Epidemiologist, Infection Control at Memorial Sloan Kettering Cancer Center **Dr. Mini Kamboj** is a board-certified infectious disease physician and Chief of the Medical Epidemiology Service. Members of this program work to prevent healthcare-associated infections (HAIs) from developing and spreading among patients and staff and are also actively engaged in several research projects on various aspects of epidemiology and prevention of HAIs.

Lisa Spedalle, a registered nurse for the Visiting Nurse Service, cares with great dedication for patients on the Upper East Side who are recovering in their own homes. Her patients are the best part of nursing, she says.

Janette Gautier served for three decades on the American Federation of Television and Radio Artists' national and local boards. She started volunteering at Church of the Epiphany's Dinner for the Homeless in 1988 and became its Volunteer Coordinator in 1995. What began as a supper for 35 women from the Lenox Hill shelter became a full sit-down three-course meal served to around 100 food-insecure men and women each Wednesday evening.

Ruth Halberg represented the 76th Assembly District on the New York Democratic State Committee for over 30 years. She was elected to the State Committee from The Democratic Club of Yorkville--where she also served as president--and continued in this position at the Lenox Hill Democratic Club. A long-time resident of the Upper East Side, Ruth's history of community activism began five decades ago when Hunter College threatened to eliminate their famous Elementary and High School Campus Schools. Ruth was instrumental in identifying an alternate site.

Zena Kaufman serves on the Board of the Sisterhood of Salaam Shalom and chair of the Fundraising Development Committee. The Sisterhood of Salaam Shalom's mission is to build trust, respect, and relationships between Muslim and Jewish women and teenage girls. Standing together, committed to stand up for one another, educate one another about our faith and cultural practices, engage in social action, and work to end acts of hate for all human beings.

Louise Merriman is Administrative Director of Clinical Nutrition at New York-Presbyterian Hospital. Her team of Registered Dietitians at New York-Presbyterian are recognized nationally for significant contributions in improving awareness and treatment of malnutrition in hospitalized patients.

Ann Meschery directs in-park events with New York City's Carl Schurz Park Conservancy. She is responsible for producing the Summer Sounds Concert Series, Sunset Film Festival, Gracie Square Art Show, and the Holiday Tree Lighting and Caroling Celebration. She served two terms on Manhattan's Community Board es resources and mentoring to opera company volunteers.

Andrea Jackson is a talent management and acquisition professional. In our community on Roosevelt Island, she is the Vice President of the Roosevelt Island Senior Association.

Bobbie Slonevsky is vice president of the Roosevelt Island Historical Society and writes and edits the digital publication, which is now in its sixth year. She has unearthed and developed dozens of previously overlooked topics of Roosevelt Island's history. She hopes to expand their reach by compiling them into a widely available book of "Roosevelt Island Vignettes."

After working for 40 years in an Advertising/Media company, Lynda Smith retired in July 2018. During her retirement, she has spent her time volunteering at a nursing home and in Assembly Member Rebecca Seawright's office. She finds enjoyment in getting to interact with some interesting people. One of her passions is traveling, which she continues to pursue during her retirement.
