I am proud to announce the passage of our Equality Amendment during a special session of the New York State Legislature, thanks to the support of our Governor Kathy Hochul, Assembly Speaker Carl Heastie, Senate Majority Leader Andrea Stewart Cousins, Senator Liz Krueger and advocates. A constitutional amendment requires passage in two successive sessions of the Legislature before it can be on the ballot for New Yorkers to vote on the proposal. I am honored to serve as the lead sponsor in the Assembly and will fight for its second passage.

As the fight over abortion rights rages across the country, the Equality Amendment is the most meaningful action the legislature can take along with growing threats to LGBTQ individuals and the continued impacts of racism and racial violence.

In the special session, we also conferenced and passed legislation to assure New Yorkers that despite the dangerous and disturbing decision by the Supreme Court to dismantle our more than 100-year-old sensible concealed carry law, we will not accept tragedies like the racist shooting in Buffalo as the cost of access to firearms.

This fall, we held our Annual Wellness and Fitness Fair in Carl Schurz Park featuring a pickleball clinic and our new Manhattan Borough Parks Commissioner Anthony Perez. It was so enjoyable to meet so many new fellow pickleball lovers.

Seawright is the prime sponsor of a new state law that compels all those convicted of hate crimes to undergo tolerance training as a condition of their sentence and rehabilitation signed by Governor Kathy Hochul.

"Hate has no place in New York State. In response to the disturbing rise in hateful acts of violence, including attacks on my district office, I introduced Assembly Bill 1202 to mandate "anti-hate" training, education and counseling for every person convicted of a hate crime. I thank and commend Governor Kathy Hochul for signing this important legislation as we are witnessing a rise in threats to Jewish and LGBTQ communities in New York and across the country. We are mourning the victims of yet another violent shooting against LGBT individuals in Colorado Springs. Education is the antidote to hate and intolerance, and our legislation is key to keeping our communities safe. I am proud to stand united with Governor Hochul against the surge in hate crimes in our State of New York," said Assembly Member Rebecca Seawright.

Seawright is also a cosponsor of a new law (A.472-C) strengthening the New York State Education Department to improve Holocaust education in the classroom.

And earlier this year, Seawright helped secure a \$1.5 million grant to the Simon Wiesenthal Center to create a "mobile museum" to teach tolerance and combat antisemitism and other forms of discrimination. The state-of-the-art mobile education center will use an interactive theater and other technology to teach tolerance and combat all forms of discrimination by focusing on the Holocaust and the American civil rights experience as critical teaching moments.

The move to ramp up education and training to promote tolerance comes as the scourge of hate crime rises in New York City and across the nation.

Seawright is proud to have just received a 100% score on the New York League of Conservation Voters Environmental Scorecard. The scorecard is an annual evaluation of State Legislators based on their support-or lack of support-for environmental legislation.

In addition to legislation, significant environmental achievements were made with the passage of the state budget this year including the \$4.2 billion Clean Water, Clean Air, and Green Jobs Environmental Bond Act that passed this November on the ballot. It will improve water and air quality, create good-paying green jobs, shore up our communities from extreme weather, reduce emissions, and fund clean water infrastructure. Critically, the Environmental Bond Act prioritizes disadvantaged communities, requiring that at least 35% of funds be invested in underserved and overburdened neighborhoods.
