



Cash Assistance Benefits Skimming Alert

Empire State Child Credit

The New York State Department of Taxation and Finance is issuing supplemental Empire State Child Credit payments to over 1.5 million low- and moderate-income New Yorkers. The 2024–2025 New York State budget provides for an additional payment to eligible taxpayers based on the Empire State child credit. If you qualify for a payment, you don't need to do anything; we will automatically calculate and send you a check for the amount you're entitled to. Energy Affordability Programs

The NYS Energy Affordability Program provides income-eligible consumers with a discount on their monthly electric and/or gas bills. You may be enrolled automatically if you receive benefits from a government assistance program. Regular HEAP Benefit

Health Insurance

New Yorkers can enroll in a Qualified Health Plan by the 15th of the month for coverage starting the 1st of the following month and benefit from new cost-sharing reductions for additional savings. HIICAP

Approximately 500 trained HIICAP counselors located in local offices for the aging across the state are available to answer New Yorkers' questions about Medicare, Medicare Advantage programs (managed care), Medicare prescription drug coverage, Medigap, and other health and long-term care insurance. EMPOWERING YOUNG WOMEN THROUGH RUNNING

NYRR Run for the Future is a free program that introduces young women* in high school to running. The program starts in the summer when participants train to run their first 5K together, creating connections that last beyond the program. They can also be part of a strong alumnae network while they continue their year-round running journeys.

Eligibility and Requirements:

- For rising 10th through 12th grade NYC high school young women
- Applicants do not have to self-identify as runners or have experience in running or sports

Practice Location and Schedule:

Practices are held in Central Park. Participants and coaches meet at the NYRR RUNCENTER featuring the New Balance Run Hub, located at 320 West 57th Street in Manhattan on Mondays, Wednesdays, and Thursdays from June 30 through August 7.

Two morning sessions are available:

Session #1: 8:00 to 10:00 a.m. Session #2: 9:00 to 11:00 a.m.

Applicants may apply for both sessions, but if accepted, will be assigned to one session. All accepted participants are required to attend orientation on June 14, 2025.



Construction Advisory

Reconstruction of York Ave. Combined Sewer and Water Main Project

The NYC Department of Design and Construction (NYC DDC) manages the Reconstruction of York Avenue, Combined Sewer and Water Main Project ID# SEN002169, upgrading existing infrastructure facilities along York Avenue, between East 61st Street and East 63rd Street, and on E. 62nd Street between York Avenue and 1st Avenue in the Upper East Side of Manhattan.

The city's scope includes replacing combined sewers, water mains, catch basins, fire hydrants, new street lighting, traffic signal upgrades, and full road restoration. Several of these operations have been delayed due to Con Edison's underground utility work, which requires extreme caution and hand-digging excavations. The anticipated completion date for this project is the summer of 2025. Please find the latest report here.
