This week, I appeared on CBS affiliate Channel 6 Albany with reporter Tom Eschen to discuss the recently released New York State Master Plan on Aging. The plan provides a roadmap for legislation and budgetary investments needed to fulfill our commitment to being an age-friendly state.

Last year, the New York City Police Department (NYPD) reported that 54 percent of all hate crimes in New York City were against Jewish New Yorkers; during the first quarter of 2025, that number rose to 62 percent. To address the unprecedented rise in Antisemitism, I am sponsoring a town hall with expert speakers on Tuesday, July 29, at Lenox Hill Neighborhood House. I hope you may join us for an important discussion.

### **NYS Response to Federal Cuts**

In response to devastating federal cuts in the so-called "Big Beautiful Bill," including the failure to reauthorize the Older Americans Act, a lifeline for programs like Meals on Wheels, senior transportation, and caregiver support, Assembly Member Rebecca Seawright is rebuffing this assault on older adults. This week Seawright cosigned a letter to the President and Members of Congress who supported House Resolution 1, about the devastating impacts of cuts to the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP). The Assembly will hold a special session this summer amid the uncertainty caused by federal cuts.

This will be the first time in the modern history of SNAP that the federal government will no longer ensure that the lowest-income families with children, older adults, and people with disabilities in every state have access to the food assistance they need.

Most states will be required to pay 5-15% of food benefits. If a state is unable to make up for these massive federal cuts, leaders will have to cut the SNAP program, restricting eligibility, or opt out of the program and terminate food assistance.

## **Strengthening Emergency Medical Services**



First responders run toward danger in the most harrowing situations – that's why the Assembly took action to support and strengthen Emergency Medical Services (EMS) across the state. Legislation cosponsored by Assembly Member Seawright passed to address staffing shortages by requiring municipalities to create plans that ensure reliable service (A.8086-A), provide critical relief by removing EMS funding from the real property tax cap (A.2177-A) and cut costs for EMS agencies by exempting them from Thruway tolls (A.34).

**Farmers Market Incentive for SNAP Recipients** 



Farmers markets across the country offer incentives to shoppers who use SNAP to purchase local food, but it all started here in NYC over ten years ago. Health Bucks are \$2 coupons sponsored by the New York City Department of Health and Mental Hygiene that can be used to purchase fresh fruits and vegetables at all NYC farmers markets. Spend \$2 in SNAP/EBT/Summer EBT, receive a bonus \$2 Health Buck up to \$10 per visit! This incentive stretches a SNAP budget and encourages shoppers to spend more of their monthly food assistance allotment on fresh produce from the market. Spend \$2 in SNAP/EBT/Summer EBT, get a bonus \$2 Health Buck up to \$10 per visit at all Greenmarket and Farmstand locations.

Health Bucks are accepted at all Greenmarket and Farmstand locations for the purchase of fresh fruits and vegetables.

At <u>GoodCauseNYC.org</u>, a brand-new website, NYC tenants can enter their address and answer a short set of questions to determine if their apartment unit is eligible for protections, and access resources to fight back against an unjust rent hike or lease nonrenewal. The site also includes a rent increase calculator to help renters determine if their rent hike is considered "unreasonable" by the law.

#### **Empire State Child Credit**

If you qualify for a payment, you don't need to do anything; we will automatically calculate and send you a check for the amount you're entitled to. 
