As your Assemblyman, I will continue to fight for our local farmers and businesses, our first responders and veterans, and for everyday Americans and taxpayers. My one and only goal is to ensure your life is as burden-free as possible.

Legislation I Am Fighting For:

- Gives state income tax credit to volunteer firefighters and members of a volunteer ambulance corps in good standing up to \$1,200 (A.185).
- Bella's Law requires the state of New York to investigate any individual accused of animal cruelty for domestic violence (A.1276).
- Gabby's Law establishes a 'Teal Alert' for missing adults between the ages of 18 and 64 in New York, opts New York into the Ashanti Alert Act (A.03230).
- Helen's Law creates a violent felony offender registry that requires violent criminals to register in a database for public viewing and investigative purposes (A.3665).
