# **Demanding Funds for Lead Line Replacement**

The research is clear — there is no safe level of lead in drinking water.

At the Joint Legislative Budget Hearing on Health, I repeated my demand for funding for the state's <u>Lead Service Line Replacement Program</u> (LSLRP).

In Newburgh and Poughkeepsie (which I represent), the work has begun — but there is much more to do. The money must be distributed to municipalities so they can move quickly to remove lead-contaminated drinking water.

The cost decreases dramatically when neighborhoods and large areas can be worked on at once, as opposed to the current piecemeal approach. Larger removal projects could be done with available funding from the Infrastructure Act, the Clean Water Act, and the Environmental Bond Act.

We know the serious health risks of lead exposure, we know what needs to be done. We can't allow another generation of New York's children to be poisoned with lead.

## **FAST FACTS**

Employers in Orange County pay approximately **\$25 million** for the MTA Mobility Payroll Tax each year

Orange County residents pay **\$8.57 million** annually for the additional mortgage tax to the MTA

**\$1.46 million** in sales tax from Orange County goes to the MTA each year

The county also pays **\$620,000** for station maintenance and operations

# **Time for Orange County to Stop Funding the MTA**

At the Joint Legislative Transportation Budget Hearing, I quizzed the CEO of the Metropolitan Transportation Authority (MTA) on just how much Orange County contributes to them each year. He didn't have the numbers, but I did – and it's shocking how many millions of dollars are leaving Orange County to fund the MTA, in exchange for very little service for the county.

That's why I'm sponsoring a bill in the Assembly, with James Skoufis in the State Senate, to have Orange County leave the MTA.

# **Opposing the Social Security Office Closing in Poughkeepsie**

I was glad to join Rep. Pat Ryan's press conference opposing the closing of the Social Security Office in the City of Poughkeepsie. This is a disservice to New Yorkers, especially after the closure of Social Security offices in Newburgh (which I represent) and Kingston.

It's absurd to think that people in Poughkeepsie will travel an hour away to Middletown for help with their Social Security payments or Medicare. Many do not have transportation. The Social Security Administration could easily find space in the library or other public spaces in Poughkeepsie, but it chose to shut down access instead.

No matter who people voted for president, nobody voted for the dismantling of Social Security and Medicare. Thank you to Congressman Ryan for bringing awareness to this issue.

#### **BILLS I'M SPONSORING**

<u>A2736</u> - Requires transparency in utility rate increase requests, including from Central Hudson

<u>A2738</u> - Bans the use of sewage and wastewater pollution in fertilizer

<u>A5023</u> - Prohibits matching funds for campaign contributions made in cash or cryptocurrency

A5032 - Requires all parts of a gun to be destroyed in gun buyback programs, and forbids the resale of gun parts
