April - National Donate Life Month

Over 100,000 people are waiting for a call that determines the fate of their life, and that waiting list only continues to grow. The men, women and children on the organ transplant list rely on us. By registering to be an organ donor, we have the power to help more people receive this life-changing call and live a longer life. In order to spread awareness about the need for more organ, eye and tissue donors, the month of April is recognized as National Donate Life Month. This year's theme is, "Life is a beautiful ride," because all who register as an organ donor and support this cause are helping to make life a beautiful ride for others.

New York witnessed a record-breaking spike in donor registration this past year, with over 600,000 new donors being added to the state's Donate Life Registry, but the demand for organ, eye and tissue donations still greatly surpasses the number of registered donors. New York State has the third-highest need for donors in the country, yet has the second-lowest percentage of registered donors. As a result, a New Yorker dies every 18 hours waiting for an organ transplant. Currently, 10,000 people in New York State are still waiting for an organ. Although there have been many advances in medical technology in recent years, another person is still being added to the national waiting list every 10 minutes.

Proper disposal of unused prescription and over-the-counter medications is important to protect both people and the environment. Unused prescription and over-the-counter medications that remain in the home can cause serious harm to people if they are taken accidently, intentionally misused or inappropriately given to someone else. Studies show that a majority of abused prescription drugs are obtained from family and friends, including the home medicine cabinet. Unused medications that are flushed down the toilet or poured down the sink can enter the water supply, harming fish and other wildlife and posing a potential risk to people.
