

## Assemblywoman Woerner: Supporting our communities



#### Supporting Greenwich students

- To help the Greenwich Central School District continue to give students a solid foundation for the future, Assemblywoman Woerner secured \$25,000 in additional funding for the school district in 2017.
- Assemblywoman Woerner also helped provide \$500,000 for the Greenwich Future Farmers of America (FFA) to purchase ag-tech equipment to be shared between local FFA programs in Washington County.
- She also secured an additional \$5,000 for the Greenwich Free Library to replace its audiovisual system.

## Aiding community building renovations

Assemblywoman Woerner is working to provide \$125,000 for much-needed renovations to the Greenwich Village Hall.

#### Looking out for veterans

Assemblywoman Woerner understands the important role veterans' organizations play within the local community, which is why she secured \$5,500 each for American Legion Liberty Post 515 and VFW Post 7291 to complete renovations.

## Safeguarding recreational opportunities

Assemblywoman Woerner secured:

- \$250,000 for the recreation center at Hudson Crossing Park to provide more amenities for local families as they enjoy the outdoors
- \$125,000 for the Cossayuna Lake Improvement District to purchase weed-harvesting equipment.

#### Increasing public protection

Assemblywoman Woerner provided:

- \$10,000 to the Easton-Greenwich Rescue Squad Inc. to upgrade its advanced airway management capabilities
- \$5,000 for the Cambridge-Greenwich Police Department to purchase a new police computer.

### Revitalizing historic landmarks

Assemblywoman Woerner secured \$250,000 for the renovation and stabilization of the Susan B. Anthony home in Battenville. An important landmark for our region, with the repairs funded by this grant the Susan B. Anthony home will be a cherished landmark for generations to come.
