
- Boosters for all adults

New Laws

A7088 Signed into Law!

This week, Governor Hochul signed my bill, A7088, an act authorizing the Town of Danby in Tompkins County to provide that real property which has been acquired for the purpose of the preservation of an open space or open area may be partially exempt from local real property taxation, provided that the owner or owners of such real property enter into a conservation easement agreement with the municipality.

Low Income Household Water Assistance Program

Do you need help paying for overdue water and wastewater bills? The **Low Income Household Water Assistance Program (LIHWAP)** can help.

LIHWAP is a drinking water and wastewater emergency assistance program funded through new federal resources. Benefits are based on the amount of unpaid water and wastewater bills owed by applicants. This assistance is targeted at low income households and income guidelines will mirror that of the Home Energy Assistance Program (HEAP).

LIHWAP benefits are based on the actual amount of drinking water and/or wastewater arrears, up to a maximum of \$2,500 per drinking water or wastewater provider, or \$5,000 if drinking water and wastewater services are combined, per household. Benefits are paid directly to the household's drinking water and/or wastewater vendor(s).

Bell Station Land Deal Finalized

I am thrilled to <u>share the news</u> that the Finger Lakes Land Trust and NYSEG have finalized the Bell Station land deal to preserve the Bell Station property in Lansing as a protected state forestland. A huge thanks to all of you who wrote letters and made phone calls to make sure this very special property was preserved.

This large tract of pristine shoreline and forestlands serve a critically important role in preserving the health and integrity of Cayuga Lake. Preserving the forestlands will not only protect the lake from land erosion runoff and negative impacts of shoreline septic systems but will preserve the land for tourism and ecological education.
