• The Bob Cecile Community Center bought supplies to help senior citizens stay active and engaged in social events, thanks to a \$5,000 grant secured by Assemblyman William B. Magnarelli.

"I am glad that the funds were put to use to make the Bob Cecile Community Center more inviting to local residents," said Assemblyman Magnarelli. "Senior citizens have contributed substantially to our community. This is one small way of continuing to contribute to their well-being."

The center bought card tables, exercise equipment, a Wii system and flat screen television with the grant.

The center is open five days a week to accommodate about 250 senior citizens' needs for socialization,

recreation and nutrition. An exercise program, a lunch program, bingo games, parities, and sing-a-longs are among the activities the center offers regularly.

Seniors who regularly visit the center appreciate the new Wii system. A 93year-old man who used to love bowling until medical conditions kept him from playing has shown a talent for winning on the Wii system's game, said Terry Losty, director of the Bob Cecile Community Center.

"This helped improve the quality of programs at the Cecile Center for the senior community," Losty said. "We are having so much fun with the equipment."
