# Magnarelli Scores for the Town of Van Buren

• Harbour Heights Park residents have a new half-court to practice on, thanks in part to a grant from Assemblyman Magnarelli. The \$15,000 grant funded the construction of a half basketball court, which consisted of removal of topsoil and subgrade materials, placement of six inches of stone base, placement of 3.5 inches of asphalt for the court surface, procurement and installation of basketball pole, backboard and rim and court stripping. Residents of all ages have taken to the court to practice their skills.

• The Rescue Mission has been serving the Syracuse area for the past 125 years. As part of their celebration, Assemblyman Magnarelli took a tour of the Rescue Mission and was briefed on the new and long-standing programs to help serve the needy, homeless and underserved in the Syracuse area.

The tour of the Syracuse campus showcased a compassionate, professional staff dedicated to treating those in need with dignity, respect and love. Some of the facilities that the campus includes are:

- Food Services Center where more than 600 meals are served every day;
- Clothing Outreach Program provides free clothing and household items in a clean, bright store setting;
- Gifford Place residence provides assistance to formerly homeless and addicted men.
- Transformations emergency shelter provides beds for more than 100 men each night.
- Employment Resource Center help individuals overcome hiring obstacles, obtain job skills and find meaningful work.
- Homeless Intervention Service is a mobile service delivering meals and supplies to people living on the streets and transports the homeless to and from area shelters, to legal, medical and job appointments.

• It's back to school time. Assemblyman Magnarelli met with students at OnPoint for College to talk to them a little about the importance of a college education.

For more than 10 years, OnPoint for College has helped over 2000 youth to get into college, stay there, and succeed afterwards. OnPoint staff and mentors help the college students through the enrollment process and college with tutoring, transportation, housing and supplies. Staff members also drive the students to colleges, visit them to help them stay on track, and go to their graduations. And since 2008, OnPoint has helped many graduates secure jobs afterward. On Point for College started from the trunk of executive director Ginny Donohue's car, in 1999.



• A bipartisan coalition of state, local and community leaders in Syracuse initiated a comprehensive effort to remove litter from city highways. The new local effort is the result of a meeting convened by State Senators John DeFrancisco and David Valesky and Assemblyman William Magnarelli, which included representatives from the New York State Department of Transportation, City of Syracuse, Onondaga County, Downtown Committee, Sierra Club, OCRRA and Syracuse University.

The initial meeting resulted in an agreement between the State, City, and County DOTs to work together to pick up litter along a two-mile section of 690 between the



Thompson Road and Teal Avenue exits during the week of July 9. Twenty-four members of the City and County public works departments and state DOT traffic control personnel used three city street sweepers and a half dozen other trucks to clear three tons of litter and debris from this single section of highway.

The coalition partners will also roll out an awareness campaign about the litter problem and associated short- and long-term costs to the community. There will be more scheduled cleanups along sections of the interstates.

"All parties pulling in the same direction and with the same focus and goal have made all the difference. The NYS DOT, City, County and concerned community partners have put in place a model that can be replicated to clean up our community," Assemblyman Magnarelli said. "Collaborative efforts between my office and Senators DeFrancisco's and Valesky's Offices supported the efforts of the City, County and State workers who collected an extraordinary amount of litter this past week. Now we need the collaborative efforts of everyone in our community to stop the littering."
