Legislative Updates



Although the Legislature is out of session until January, I am still carrying your voices forward and continuing to prepare for the year ahead. My top priority right now is energy. As utility bills rise, I am dedicated to being the fighting voice for my constituents.

With the release of the 2025 Draft Plan, I was alarmed and immediately jumped into action. This draft plan examines 20 topic areas of concern, including fuel types, alternatives, climate change, energy innovation, and energy affordability impact analysis. The Plan evaluates the state's current and future energy needs and provides a roadmap to pursue clean energy goals following the passage of the CLCPA in 2019.

The report shockingly projected New Yorkers would be paying roughly \$1,282 extra per month through 2040 in order to achieve the state's ambitious climate goals.

I attended Assemblyman Phil Palmesano's Energy Tour stop in Monroe County on behalf of our district. Now it is your turn to take a stand. Until Oct. 6, you can submit comments on the Draft State Energy Plan.
