Even Year Constitutional Amendment

While national headlines continue to focus on Washington, important decisions are being made right here in Albany that could have a lasting impact on our local communities. One issue I believe deserves more attention is a proposed amendment to the New York State Constitution that would move elections for constitutionally elected local offices, including county clerks, sheriffs, district attorneys and certain judges, to even-numbered years.

I voted NO when this amendment passed the Legislature for the first time. If it passes a separately elected Legislature again, it could then go before New York voters. But before we get to that point, there are significant questions about the transition that Albany needs to answer.

As a former Livingston County Clerk, I understand the practical realities of these offices. Elected officials rely on deputies, assistants, undersheriffs and other appointed personnel whose authority and oaths can be tied to the term of the official who appointed them.

That raises an important question: What happens when current terms expire at the end of 2029 as New York transitions to the new election cycle? County clerks, sheriffs, district attorneys and judges provide essential services. We cannot risk uncertainty over who has the legal authority to carry out those responsibilities on January 1, 2030.

Supporters argue that moving these elections could increase voter participation by placing them alongside state and federal races. That discussion is worth having. But increased turnout does not eliminate the need for a clear and legally sound transition plan.

There is also a broader question about whether local elections will receive the attention they deserve when placed on ballots dominated by races for president, governor, Congress and the state Legislature. Changing our state constitution should never be taken lightly.

Before this proposal moves forward again, Albany needs to provide clear answers, protect the continuity of local government and ensure there are no unintended consequences for the communities we serve.

Until those questions are answered, I cannot support this constitutional amendment.

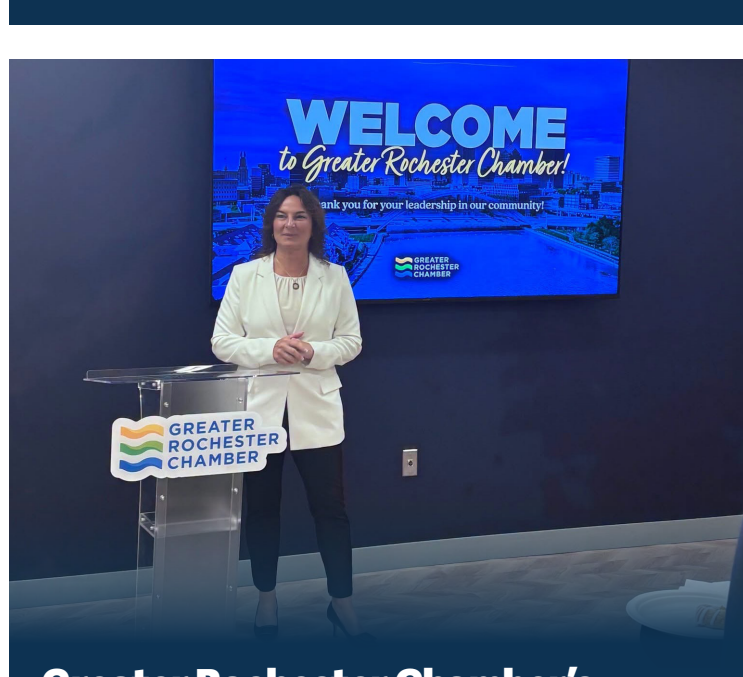
Western New York Firemen's Convention Parade

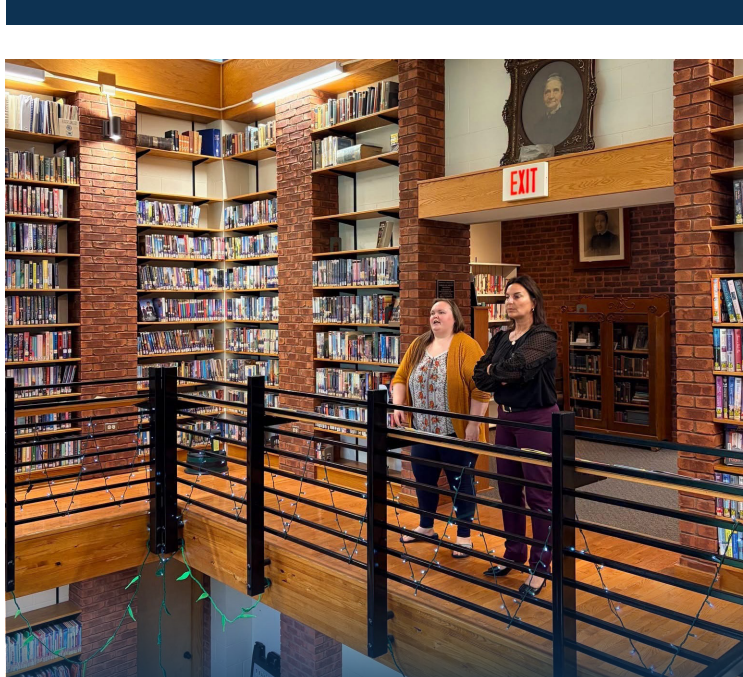
Lima Crossroads Festival
