

Locations:

- Erie and Niagara counties are bordered by two Great Lakes and the Niagara River
- Kayak and canoe rentals are available throughout the region
- Amherst Veterans Canal Park, 1040 Tonawanda Creek Road, has kayak launches, parking and restrooms
- West Marine Park, 4070 Tonawanda Creek Road, North Tonawanda, has kayak launches, parking and restrooms
- Ellicott Creek Park, 1 Ellicott Creek Drive, Tonawanda, has launches, parking and picnic areas

Safety Tips:

- · Wear a life jacket
- · Apply sunblock
- · Pack a snack and stay hydrated
- Bring a whistle to alert larger vessels of your presence
- Turn your canoe or kayak to face large waves to prevent being overturned

- Find onshore shelter when you hear thunder
- On-the-water paddling Safety Courses are available
- All motorboat operators will need a boating safety certificate beginning in 2025

HIKING

Locations:

- Walk along Ellicott Creek from Glen Park to Amherst State Park at 400 Mill Street in Williamsville
- Walton Woods Park's pond walk is located off John James Audubon Parkway at Gordon R. Yeager Road in Amherst
- Great Baehre Conservation Area features the Great Baehre Swamp Wildlife Management Area and the accessible-for-all Billy Wilson Park at 1290 Hopkins Road in Amherst
- Amherst State Park offers several trails, including the Veterans Memorial Trail and West Ellicott Creek Trail
- Nature View Park is a large and ecologically diverse conservation area located across from the Amherst Veterans Canal Park
