THE HALT ACT SEVERELY LIMITS
SEGREGATED CONFINEMENT,

RISING VIOLENCE IN PRISONS:

- 189% INCREASE IN INCARCERATED-INDIVIDUAL-ON-INCARCERATED-INDIVIDUAL ASSAULTS
- 76% INCREASE IN INCARCERATED-INDIVIDUAL-ON-STAFF ASSAULTS

All since HALT became law.

WHO'S PAYING THE PRICE:

CORRECTIONAL OFFICERS ARE LEFT DEFENSELESS, CREATING DANGEROUS CONDITIONS FOR BOTH STAFF AND INCARCERATED INDIVIDUALS.²

HALT REPEALER (A.3217):

WOULD RESTORE BALANCE AND GIVE OFFICERS THE TOOLS THEY NEED TO PROTECT THEMSELVES AND OTHER INCARCERATED INDIVIDUALS.

LOOMING PRISON CLOSURES:

David voted NOT⁴ to allow the Governor the power to close New York prisons on an expedited 90 day basis, bypassing the standard one-year notice requirement.



HEAVY-HANDED EXECUTIVE ORDERS:

The Governor signed an Executive Order⁵ barrings corrections officers who participated in statewide walk-outs from being hired for state jobs, preventing them from being employed as police or peace officers in state and local jurisdictions.



STAFF SHORTAGES:

Despite chronic understaffing, the Governor terminated approximately 2,000 officers⁶ opting instead to deploy the National Guard and implement the early release of incarcerated individuals.
